The Foot and Mouth Disease (Ireland) Order 1915.

THE Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland (Veterinary Department) draw attention to the above Order, which defines the nature and scope of certain restrictions which may be applied by a sanitary Order of the Department to "scheduled districts" or a "hatched area" in the event of an outbreak of foot and mouth disease in Ireland. NOTICE TO SHEEP OWNERS
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNICAL INSTRUCTION FOR IRELAND.

SHEEP DIPPING (IRELAND) ORDER OF 1915

THE Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland desire to draw attention to the obligation which, in pursuance of the above Order, now rests on persons owning or having charge of Sheep in Ireland, to cause all such animals, excepting those exempted under the Order, to be dipped in each year between the 1st day of June and the 31st day of July, both days inclusive (the "summer dipping period"), and on two occasions separated by an interval of not less than seven days or more than fourteen days, between the 1st day of August and the 15th day of November, both dates inclusive (the "autumn dipping period"), by thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Department for sheep dipping. The only cases in which exemption from this requirement will be allowable are those indicated in the extracts from the Order which are given in the foot of this notice. The following is a summary of some of the other provisions in the Order which should also be strictly observed:

Notice of Intention to Dip.—For the purpose of enabling the Local Authority, if they so wish, to be represented at the dipping, written notice of the intention to dip, stating the time (or times) in the case of the autumn dipping, and place or places in the case of the autumn dipping, of intended dipping, the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped, and the place where each sheep are located at the time of forwarding of the notice must be given in each dipping period by the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the Order in that period, to the sergeant of police for the police sub-district in which the sheep are located. The notice must, moreover, be delivered or sent by post, each time as to be received by the local police sergeant five days at least before the intended time of dipping.

Movement to Market during Dipping Period.—Between 1st July and 31st July, both dates inclusive, in each year, any sheep sent for exposure for sale at a market, fair, or sale yard in Ireland, must be accompanied by a Declaration, signed by the owner of the sheep or his authorized agent, to the effect that the sheep have been twice dipped under the Order since 1st July in that year.

Cleaning Before Dipping in Summer Dipping Period.—Sheep dipped under the Order in the summer dipping period must have been dipped previously in the same year, but lambs under nine months old are not required to be dipped prior to the summer dipping.

Isolation of Sheep After Dipping.—All sheep when dipped under the Order in either dipping period must be kept during the remainder of that period, isolated from any practicable from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Cleaning of Dipping Places.—The place used for dipping on any farm or premises must be cleaned thoroughly without delay by the occupier, and all tools of wool must be gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

Samples of Dip may be Taken.—When sheep are being dipped under the Order the owner or person in charge is required to permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Department to take samples of the dip material which is being or has been used for the dipping.

REVOCATION.
4. The Slaughter of Animals (Ireland) Order of 1915 is hereby revoked.
APPLICATION OF ORDER.
5. This Order applies to Ireland.
INTEPRETATION.
6. In this Order "the Department" means the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland; "Local Authority" means the Local Authority under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1884 to 1914, or any Order made thereunder; or (b) slaughter of an animal necessary or desirable on account of accident, injury to the animal or its flesh; or (c) slaughter or movement out of Ireland of an animal if in the opinion of the Department the slaughter or movement out of Ireland is desirable for any exceptional reason or purpose and the slaughter or movement is authorized by a license granted by the Department or officer of the Department.
POWERS OF INSPECTORS.
3. Any Veterinary Inspector of the Department or, subject to the direction of the Department, any Inspector of a Local Authority may enter any slaughterhouse or other premises on which animals are slaughtered for human food and examine any animals or carcasses therein.
