MEETING OF CITY EXECUTIVE
Cases of Threatened Eviction
 A meeting of the Limerick City Executive of the Town Tenants' League was held on Sunday afternoon, the 29th of September, in the Mechanics' Institute, Mr. James O'Connell, president, in the chair.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the cases of threatened eviction which were dealt with at the last meeting had been satisfactorily arranged, except one, which was being handled by some friends of the League.

Some friends of the League were invited, including that of Mr. Joseph Hargrave, Dixon's lane (off the "Green"), who was summoned by his landlord, Mr. John O'Connell, to vacate the premises in possession of a room which he held for the past 33 years. The rent was paid up on Monday, 24th September, and when Hargrave tendered his rent the following week it was refused by the agent, Mr. Monaghan, and he was served with a summons for possession of the premises.

The case having been carefully considered, it was decided that a deputation should wait on the landlord to try and effect a settlement, and failing same that the case be defended at Petty Sessions.
