MEMORIAL TO THE LATE CAPTAIN SANDES.—

The High Sheriff of Kerry. Mr George Sandes,
has just presented to Listowel Church a beauti-
ful chancel window in memory of his eldest son
George, Captain 4th Battalion Royal Munster
Fusiliers, who died in Tralee, 3rd March, 1887,
in the 26th year of his age, after a short illness,
to the inexpressible grief of his relatives and
friends by whom he was greatly beloved. The sub-
ject of the window is "Faith, Hope, and
Charity," full-length figures, with coat of arms
and monogram. In corners underneath is the
inscription and the text:—"The Lord gave and
the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name
of the Lord."

At the usual weekly meeting of the City Branch
