Michael Tierney, Merchant of Limerick City leased land from John Wight, Burgess, in Ballynantybeg for 99 years. A Witness was one John Tierney.


(Michael Tierney, according to his tombstone in St. Mary's Cathedral died in 1761 aged 80. Therefore, he was born circa 1681 and was aged circa 46 in 1727. While this was a Protestant Cathedral, many Limerick Catholic families retained their pre-reformation burial rights in the graveyard).

Both John Tierney and Matthew Tierney with Ballyscanlan as their address were witnesses to a Deed on this day.

### Limerick Chronicle, Monday 02/10/1786.

Died on Sunday week at Riversdale, the seat of George Gun after a tedious and painful illness, Miss Tierny, daughter of the late Michael Tierny of the City of Limerick. (Probably the daughter of Michael Tierney and Margaret Gunn who married in 1748).

### Ennis Chronicle. Monday 18/05/1789.

Limerick 18<sup>th</sup>: Died on the 6<sup>th</sup> December last at Canton, Captain George Tierney of the East India Company's Marine. Son of the late Edmond Tierney of Limerick.

### Limerick Chronicle. Thursday 23/07/1789.

Married on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. George Tierney M.P. for Colchester to Miss Miller of Stapleton in Gloustershire.

### Waterford Herald. Thursday 05/09/1793.

Married last Saturday at Limerick, Edward Fitzgerald, late Captain in the 21<sup>st</sup> Regt of Foot to Miss Tierney, daughter of the late Edmund Tierney Esq.

### Kings Inns Admission Papers.1798.

Edward Tierney, son of John Tierney of Ballyscanlan, Co. Limerick, deceased and Mary Gleesan was educated at Rathkeale and was over 16 when he was admitted at Easter Term 1798. Affidavit as to age sworn by Mother.

### Ennis Chronicle. Monday 15/12/1800.

Advert: The Public are cautioned not to credit Catherine Flaherty otherwise Tierney, my wife, as from ill conduct I am obliged to separate from her. John X Flaherty (his mark). Annagh.

### Ennis Chronicle, Wednesday 05/10/1808.

Died at Rathkeale on Saturday week, Mrs Tierney, wife of Thomas Tierney, Brewer.

### Ennis Chronicle, Wednesday 19.10/1808.

Married at Cheswick church, Dr. Tierney of Brighton and formerly of Rathkeale, Co. Limerick to Miss Jones of Turham Green, Middlesex.

### Clare Journal, Thursday 02/02/1809.

Died last Friday evening at her house in Catherine St., Limerick, Mrs Tierney, widow of Mr John Tierney of Ballyscanlon, Co. Limerick. **Rate Book, 1810** gives an Edward Tierney living at No. 2, Catherine St.

### Kings Inns Admission Papers. 1810.

Henry Bowles was apprenticed to Edward Tierney. Henry was admitted to Kings Inns at Easter Term 1810. (*Henry married Sarah, Edward's sister in 1817*).

### Limerick Evening Post. Wednesday 22/04/1812

Married on Saturday week at St George's church Hanover Square, London, Edward Tierney of Thomas St. Limerick to Anna Maria daughter of the late Henry Jones of Bloomsberry Square and sister-in-law of Mathew J. Tierney of Brighton M.D. Physician to the Prince of Wales. **Rate Book, 1815** gives Edward occupying No. 48, a large house in Thomas St. Limerick.

### Limerick Evening Post, Wednesday 07/04/1813.

Birth at Dr. Tierney's house in Brighton on Tuesday 30/03/1813 to the lady of Edward Tierney of Limerick, a son and heir.

### Limerick Chronicle. Wednesday 27/04/1814.

**Advert:** Michael Burke plt. V. John Lawly, Johanna Lawly his wife, Executors of John Tierney, deceased dfds. Sale of part of Cahernneirhey, Parish of Croagh, late in the possession of the said John Tierney.

### Ennis Chronicle. Wednesday 14/02/1816.

Died, Mrs MacMahon, wife of Mathew MacMahon and sister to Dr Tierney, Physician in Ordinary to the Prince Regent. (Frances Tierney wife of Matthew McMahon of Dublin).

### Ennis Chronicle, Saturday 15/11/1817.

Married yesterday morning at George's church by the Rev W.D.Hoare, Henry Bowles of Limerick to Sarah, daughter of the late John Tierney of that county and sister to Dr Tierney, Physician to the Prince Regent. **The Clonmel Advertiser** adds that Henry Bowles was an Attorney-at-Law.

### Limerick General Advertiser. 11/06/1819.

Died on Monday in Dublin at the house of James Guthrie Russell, Elizabeth Guthrie wife of James Guthrie of Limerick. She was in her 71 year. (Therefore, born circa 1749. An Elizabeth was baptised 17/09/1747).

### Westmeath Guardian. 17/04/1823.

Married on the 9<sup>th</sup> at Limerick, Robert Ingram, son of the Rev Henry levers Ingram, Rector of Kilmurry, to Mary, eldest daughter of Mathew McMahon of Limerick and niece to Sir Mathew John Tierney, Bart.

### St Michaels R.C. Marriage Register 1824 – 1838.

Married on the 14/02/1825, Laurence Tierney to a Margaret Roberts.

#### The Gentleman's Magazine 1832.

Died lately at Singapore, age 24, Matthew McMahon of the Bengal Civil Service, nephew of Sir Matthew Tierney, Bart.

### Kings Inns Admission Papers. 1833.

Thomas McMahon, 3<sup>rd</sup> son of Matthew McMahon of Lower Fitzwilliam Street, Dublin, deceased and Frances Tierney was admitted at Michaelmas Term 1833. He was over 16years of age and had been educated at Brighton, Sussex. Affidavit to age sworn by Uncle, Thomas Tierney.

### *Limerick Times* 29/01/1835

Married at Missourie, E. T. Tierney of the 38<sup>th</sup> Native Regiment, Bengal, nephew of Sir Mathew Tierney, to Christina Clarke, grand-daughter of Alexander Ramsey of Kersehill.

### The Cork Examiner. 04/02/1846.

Married on Sunday morning at her uncle's house in Sexton Street, Anne, daughter of Mr. P. Grace, Merchant of Jamaica to Mr. Laurence Tierney of Limerick. (Marriage registered at St Michael's R.C. church 01/02/1846). Anne was born circa 1826. Laurence was born circa 1818.

James B. Grace, Planter. Formerly of Limerick, died on the 17/10/1860 at Kingston, Jamaica, having lived there for the previous 38 years..

### Griffith's Valuation. 1850.

Laurence Tierney lived at No 13 Ellen St., Limerick and all of his 9 children were baptised in St. Michael's R. C. church in Denmark St. The Instore shop stands on the site of Laurence's house today.

Lucy died in 1871 and Anne, her mother was her only next-of-kin. See Lucy's Will. Yet Sissie/Elizabeth her sister didn't die until 1879, aged 25 years. Anne, the mother died on the 19/12/1886 at Lower Hartstonge St. Aged 60 years and a Miss M. Tierney was alive at Hartstonge St. in the 1891 Trade Directory.



#### **Mount St Lawrence Burial Records. Limerick**

Laurence Tierney of Clare Street was buried aged 48 in 1866 in Plot Ob 35. His daughter Lucy was also buried in the same Plot, aged 21 on the 16/11/1871. She was of Upper Cecil St., Limerick. His daughter Eliza/ Elizabeth/ Sissie was of Hartstonge Street when she died aged 22 and was buried on the 16/08/1879. Her Plot number was not recorded. Anne, Laurence's wife, died at Hartstonge St. aged 60, where she kept boarders in 1886. Plot Number given as Ob 85. Miss M. Tierney was at Hartstonge St. in 1891.


Buried in Bristol in 1771, aged 46

Therefore born circa 1725.

Left 3 daughters. Penelope, M. 1784. Ann and Elizabeth, M. 1771, D.1832.

Jerome Tierney below was written as Jerome only when his marriage was announced in the Freeman's Journal in 1889. All other sources call him Jeremiah.

Thomas B. Tierney erected a Tombstone in Mount St. Lawrence, in Memory of his Father, Mother and sister Bridget as well as a Catherine Tierney. However, Jeremiah and his wife Rebecca are buried in the same grave, Yc 105 along with their youngest daughter Agatha.



10 children were born to this marriage but only 8 were living in 1911. I believe the two who died were Randal who was buried on the 11/11/1907 and Jeremiah who was buried on the 09/04/1893. Both were buried in Plot Yc 105, Mount St Lawrence. Jeremiah was only 6 weeks old and the family were living then at 63 Athlunkard St, Limerick.

Jeremiah leased 4 building sites from the Vokes sisters of Ballinacurra just west of the Three houses known as Vokes Villa's. It would seem that he built two houses and called them Querrin Villa's. He lived in No 1 and is shown there in the 1912 Postal Directory for Limerick. The other two sites seem to have been sub-leased by Jeremiah to a Mr J. Hannon.

Jeremiah and family are recorded in the 1911 Census as living at House 44, Ballinacurra Hart. A 2<sup>nd</sup> class house with 3 Front windows and 7 rooms. This goes to prove that the numbers allocated by the Census Records have no connection to the actual street numbers.
